
This year's team had a losing season but many bright spots in key positions. The boys played out of position in several games due to injury.

The Diary of Anne Frank



BACKGROUND

Anne Frank's diary was written in 1943 and 1944. Her family and the Van Daan family along with Mr. Dussel shared a "secret annexe" during the war in Amsterdam, Holland. They were all Jewish. For two long years they lived without seeing daylight or talking to anyone other than Mrs. Kraler and Miep who brought supplies.



The Band Does It Again


This year the Northwest High School band was again under the direction of Mr. E. W. Puffenberger with assistant and marching band director, Mr. William Hayward.





Knowing the challenges of making such a publication possible, we ask for the cooperation of students, faculty, and administration in the making of future yearbooks. Without it, we constantly remain





Indians Import a New System





The Season by A.W.M.

The Madison Rams confirmed pre-season predictions of being a power as they charged over the Indians 40-22. Due to a sand-lot football injury, Sr. Brad Kurtz was missing from the line-up. Doug Hamilton (155) won on a rare disqualification penalty for six team points.

The Oakwood Raiders were "pinned" three times in the last four weight classes as the fired up Braves, led by Terry Bucher (167), came from a 24-13 deficit to win 34-24.

Brian Ries (98) replaced injured Bud Amodio and scores two victories, but the Indians are so intent to scalp the Massillon Tigers they neglect to notice Akron Garfield. The highlight event was between Ike Nicholson and Larry McClendon, which had the crowd on their feet. Ike gave 18 pounds and was edged 9-8. Final tally found Garfield 60; Northwest 56; Massillon 29.

Manchester Panthers and Jackson Polar Bears got mauled by victory hungry tribe. Ike Nicholson got double pins, Jim Harris (145) scores one pin and one decision, as Indians tally 82 points. Jackson was second with 38 points and Manchester had 33. Orrville Red Riders humiliate Tribe with three State Finalists to the tune of 42-11. Reserves get treated to some "home cooking" and make plans for a "scalp party" in 1973.

McKinley Bulldogs should have brought an extra kennel as the scratched and scarred Indians post victory #5 by a score of 34-28.

"AAA" class school Akron Ellet edged out a 37-21 decision on visiting Red Men via some questionable Northern Officiating. The Orange Men swept the final four bouts to rally off 21-16 deficit.

> Warpath continued to Marietta, as Mickey Podnar upsets Swanton's NW Tourney champ Dennis Staples. Brad Ross (126) set Quick Pin mark of the year in 0:22 seconds. Dale Dodrill scores dual victories but is lost remainder of the year. Howard Fierstos scores 10 team points. The final score was NW 78; Swanton 51; Marietta 45.





A new face at Northwest this year has been that of Elaine Keller. She teaches general math, algebra I, and senior math and serves as an advisor to the sophomore class.




MISS NORTHWEST: LINDA ROSS
