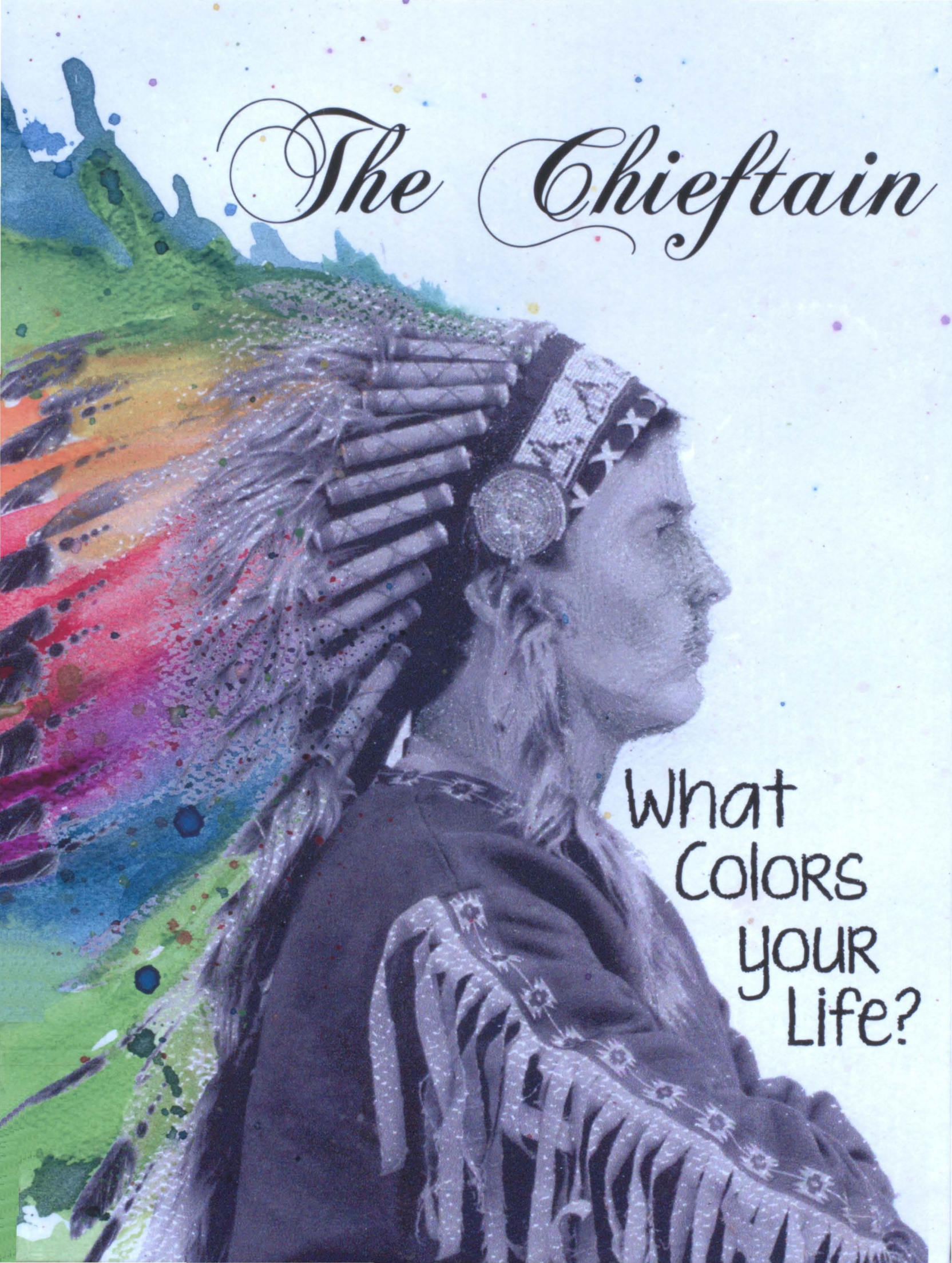
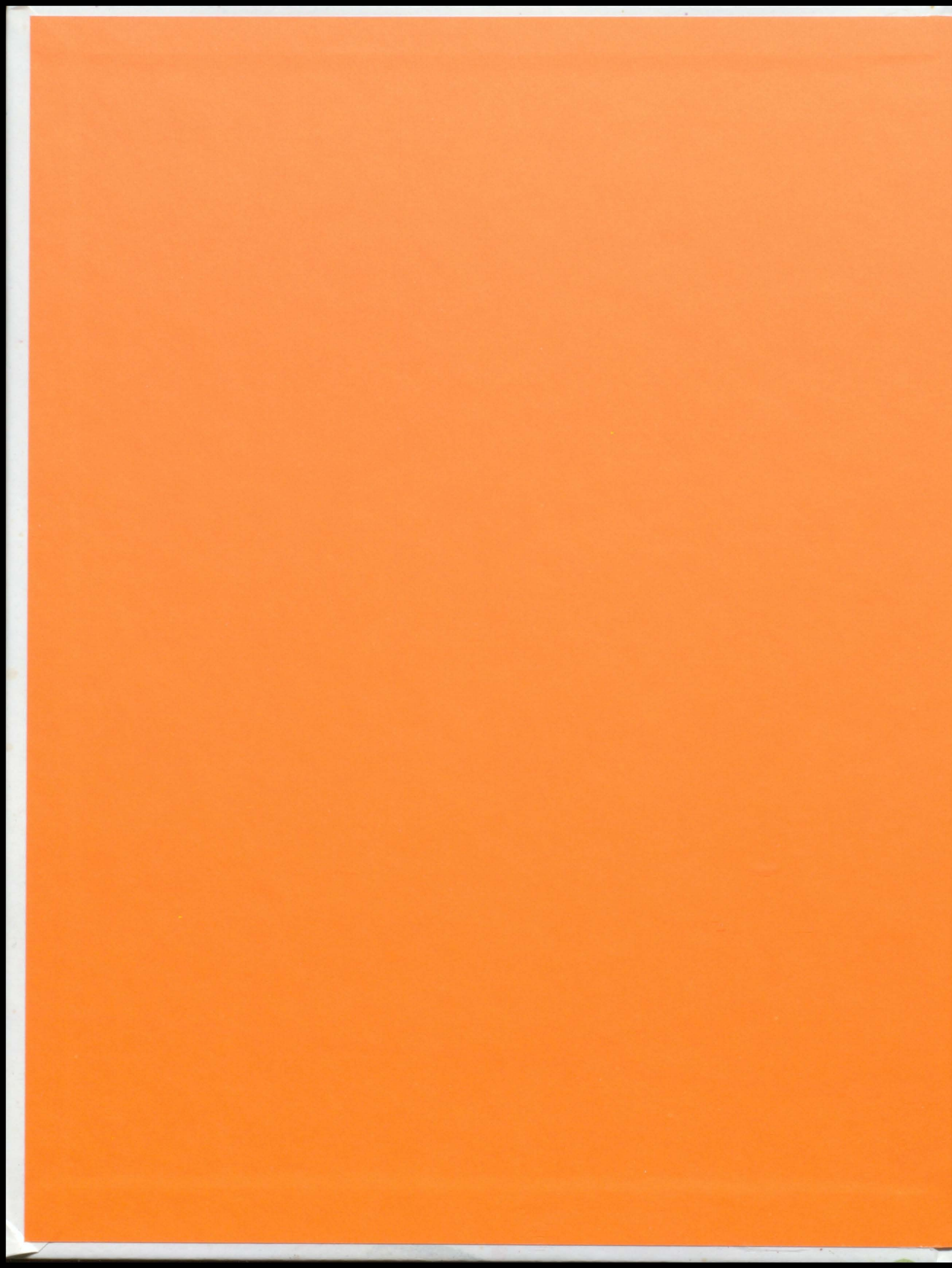
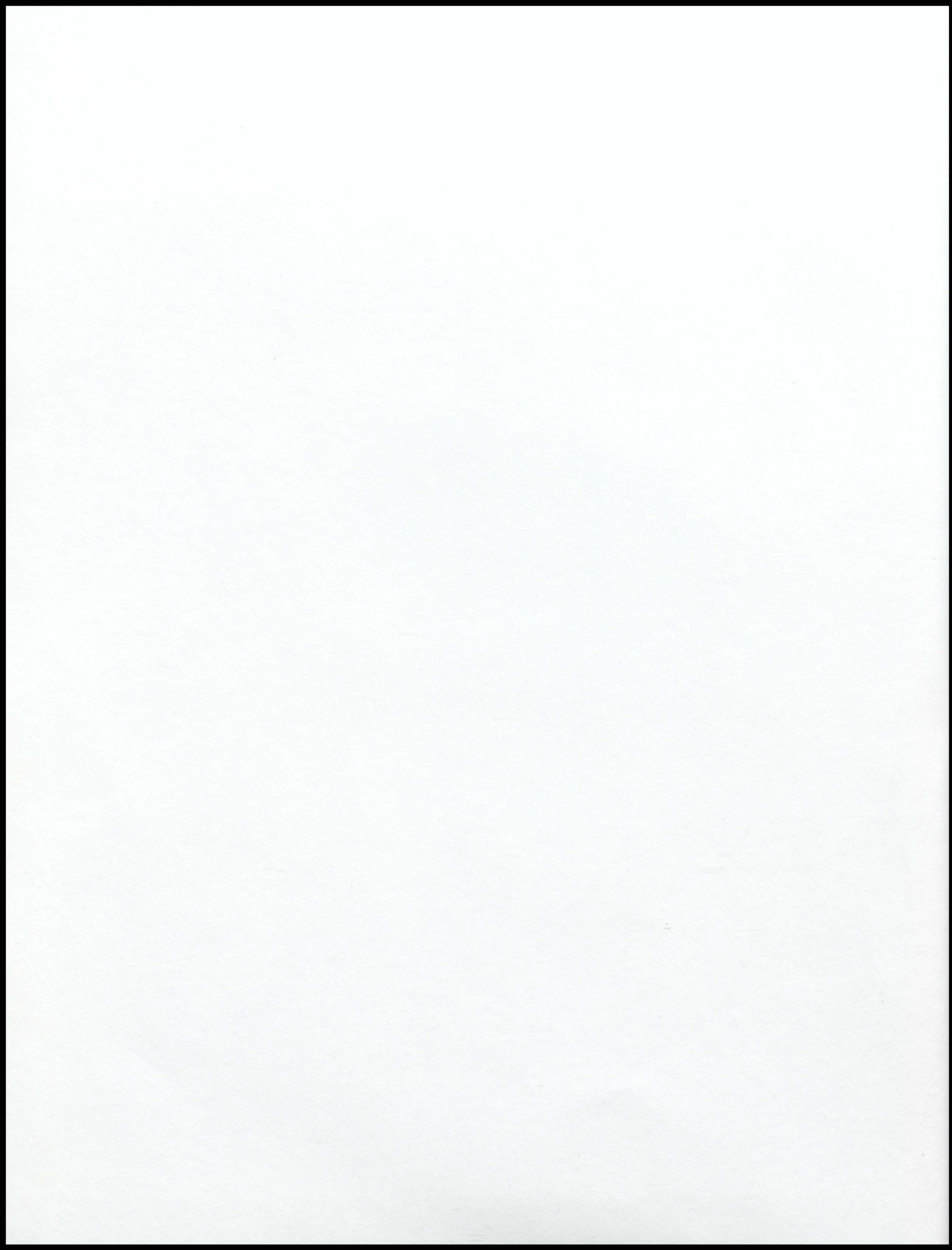

Abigail Bonnot

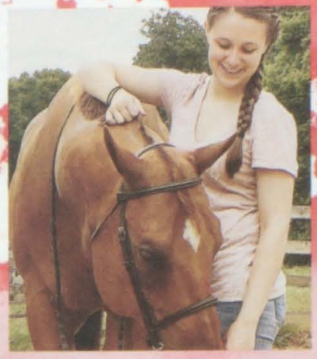

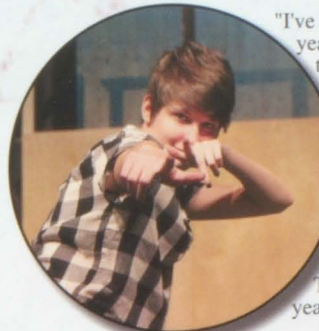

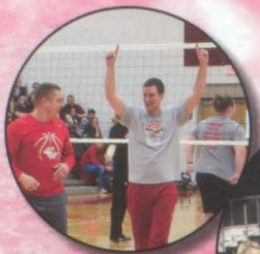


"When you're stressed, you eat ice cream, cake, chocolate, and sweets. Why? Because stressed spelled backwards is desserts."

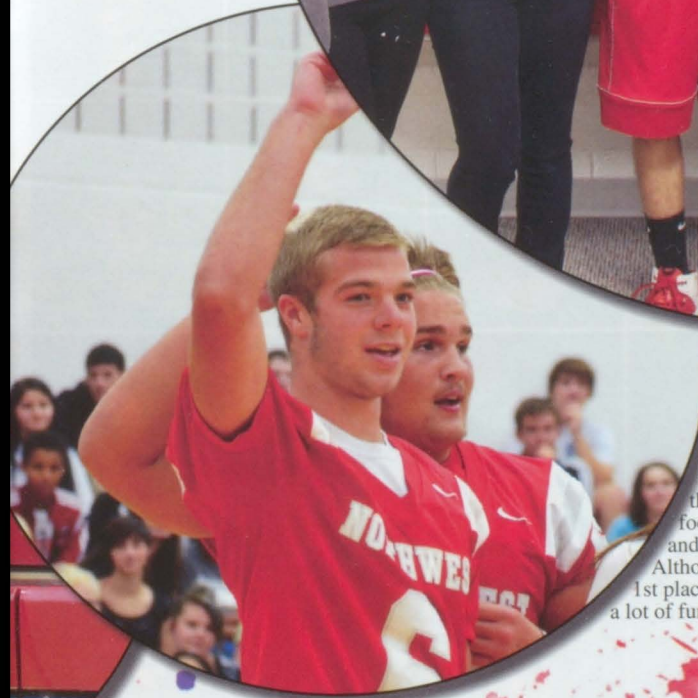

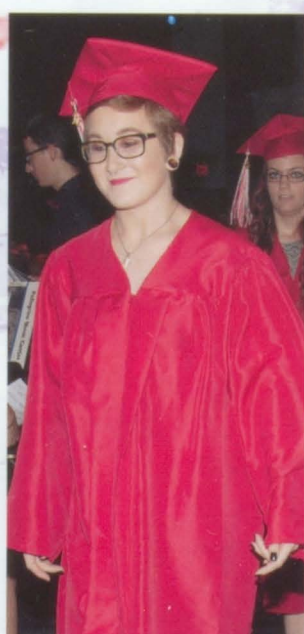
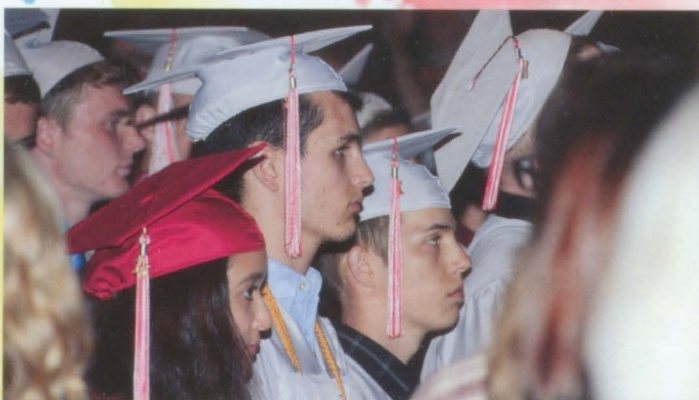
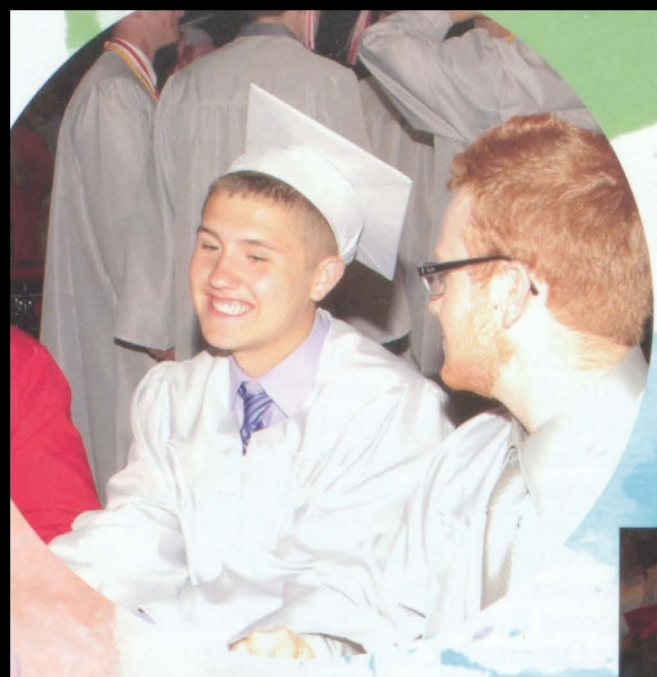




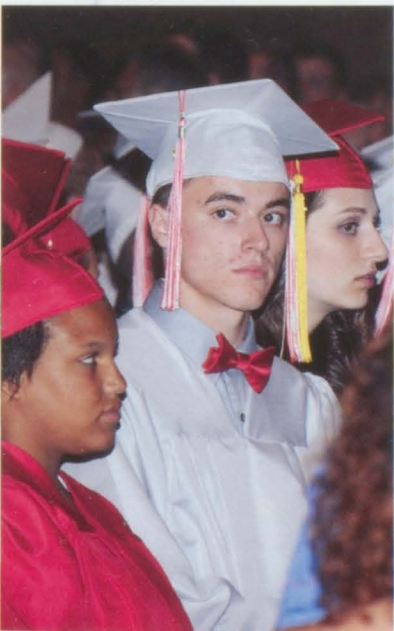
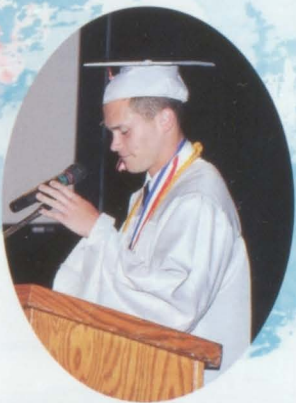
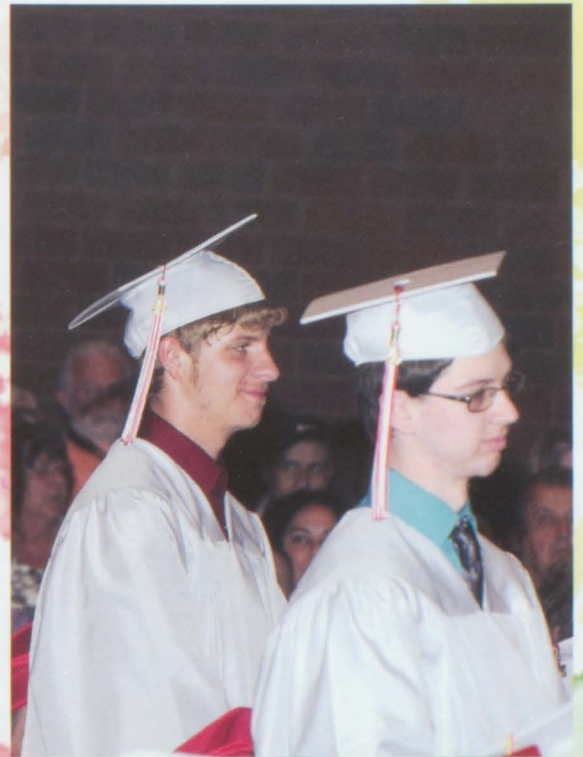
A Splatter of S.W.O.R.D.

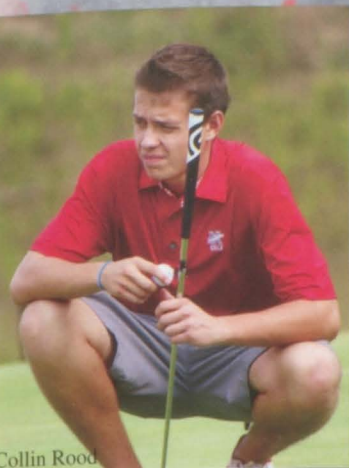

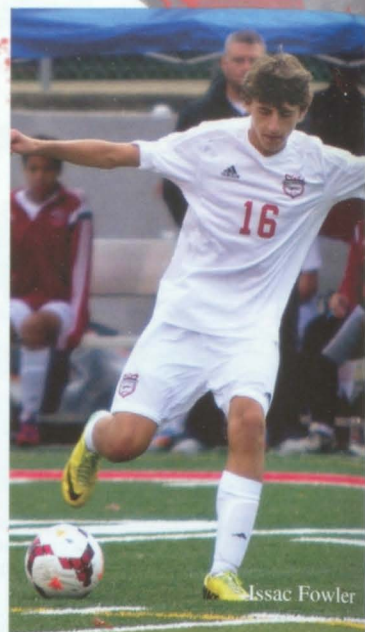
A Rush To Victory

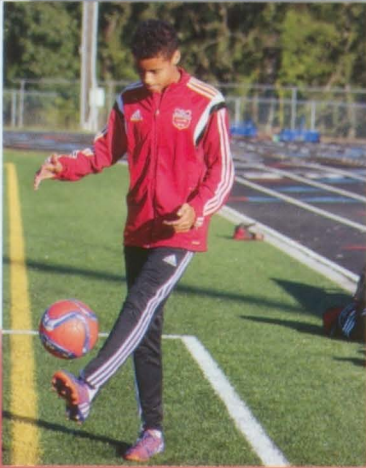

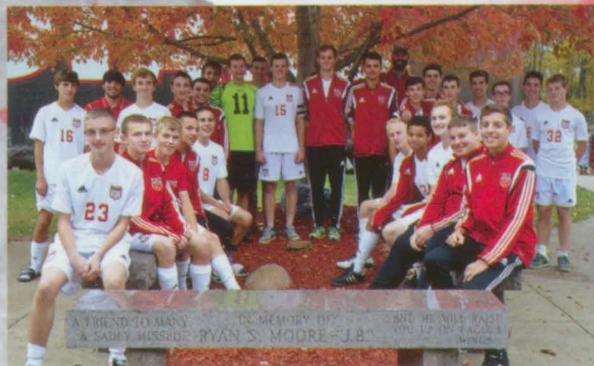

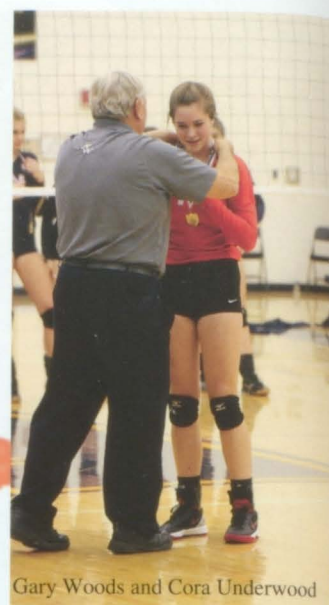
Journey to Regional Finals

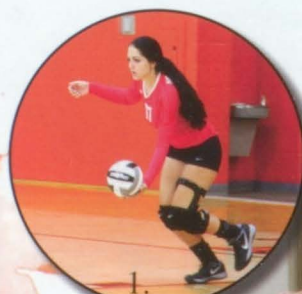

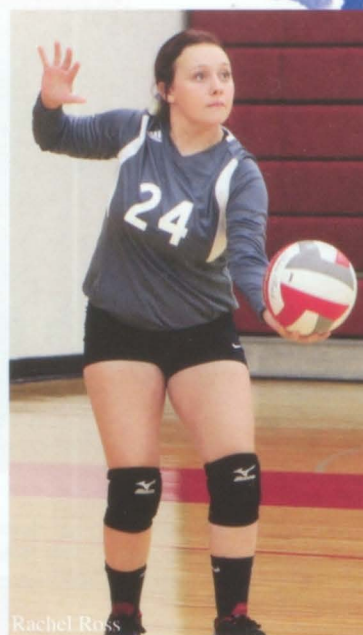
A Sprinkle of JV Volleyball

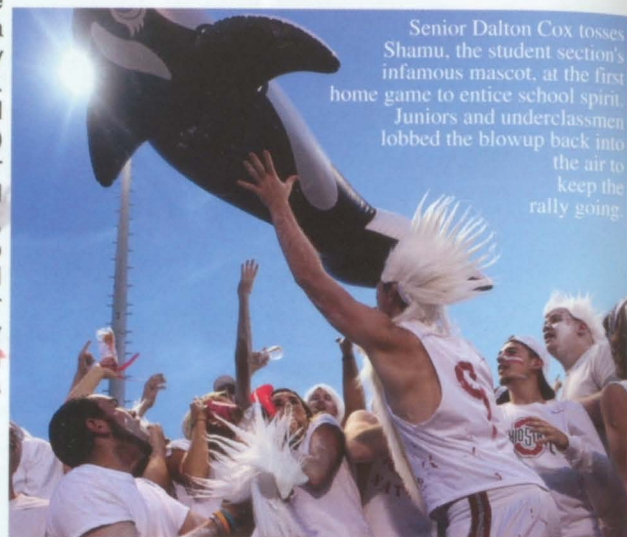

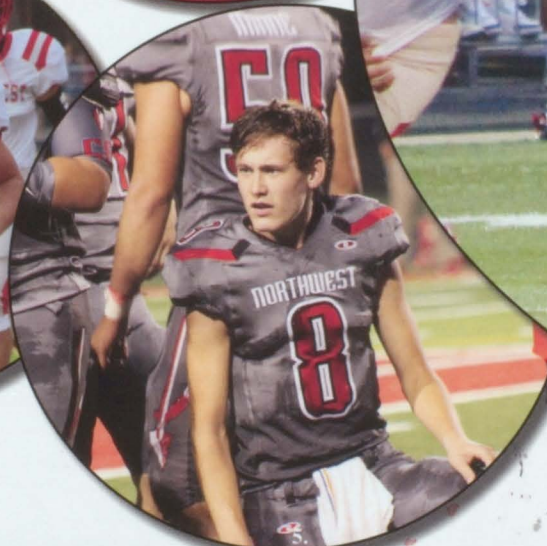

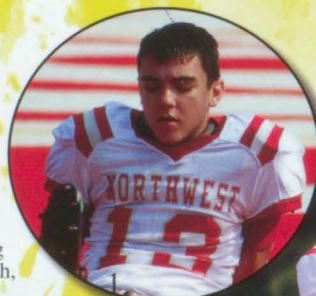

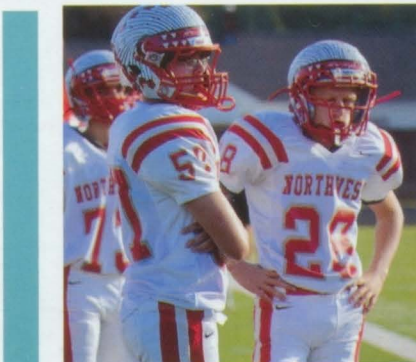

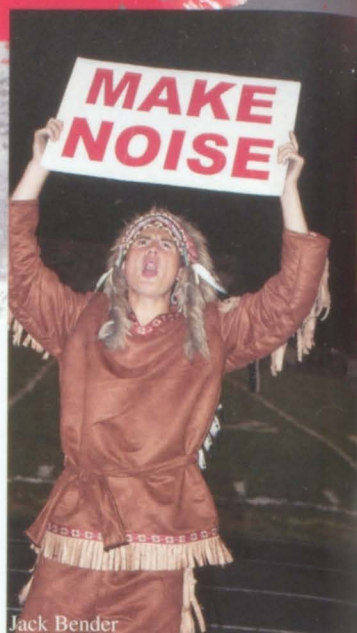
Welcome to Indian Country

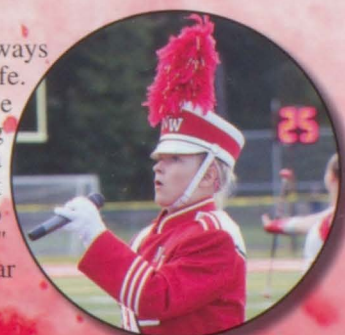

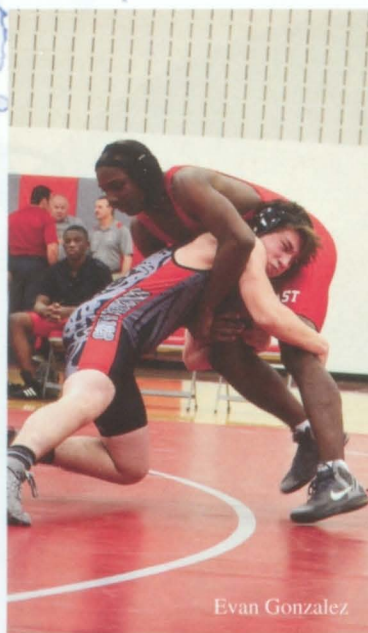
A PINch of Wrestling

Injuries and Victories.

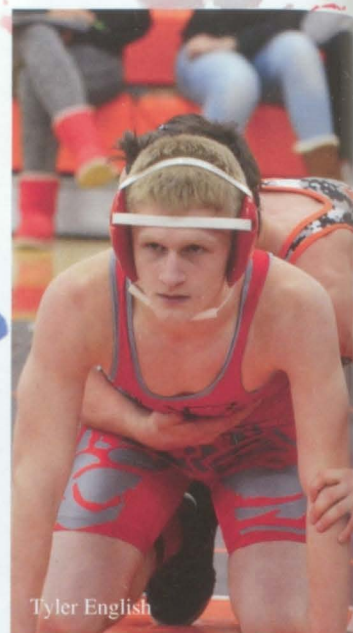

Worn out and tired, the wrestling team never gave in to their pain. Winning was their goal, recovering was their strategy, and achieving a well-deserved post-season was their prize.

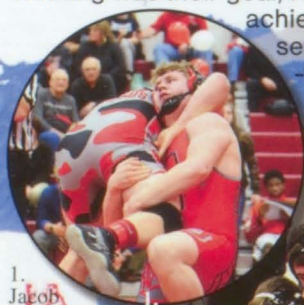

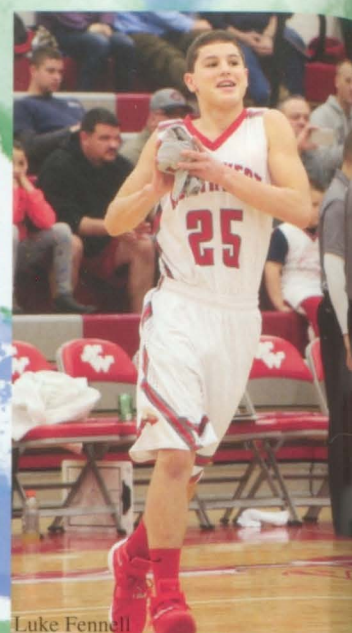
A Pass of Varsity Basketball

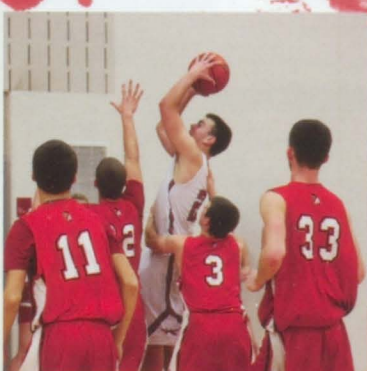

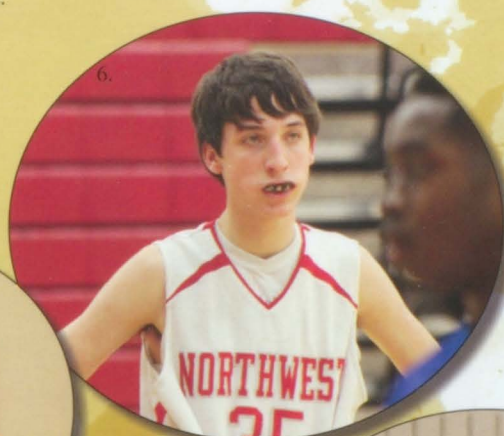
A Spark of... Freshman Basketball

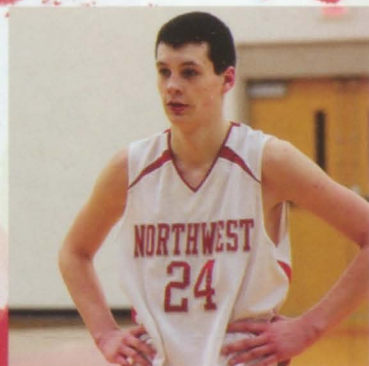

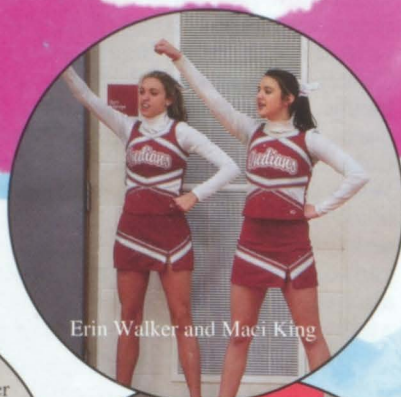

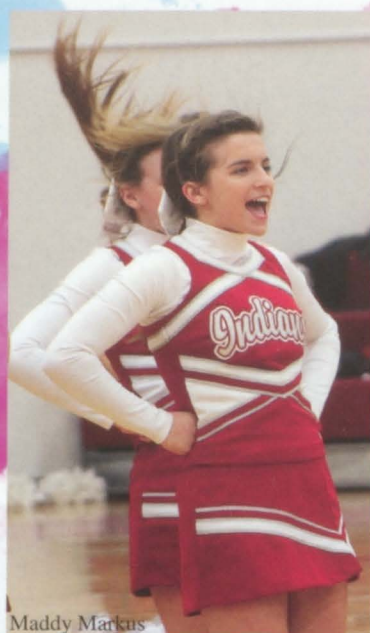

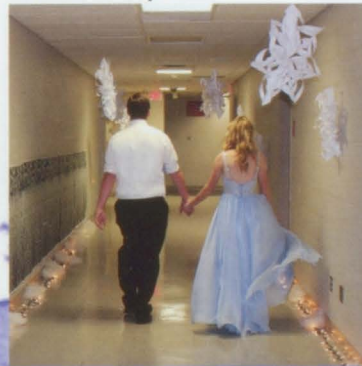

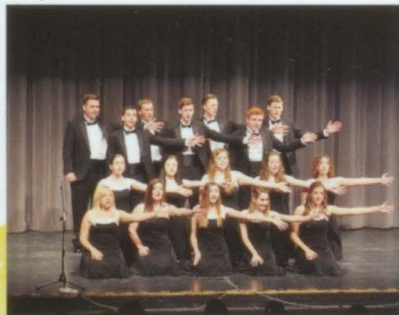

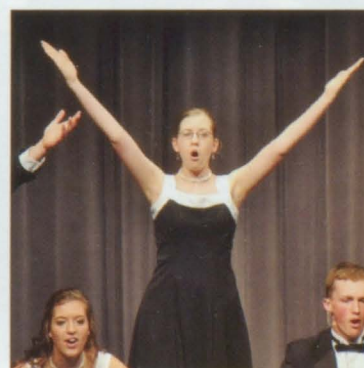

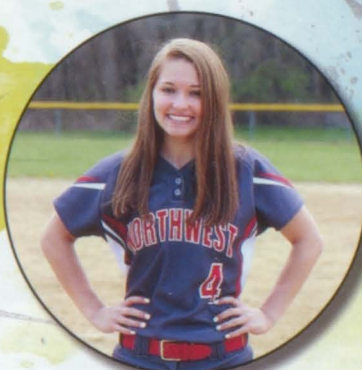

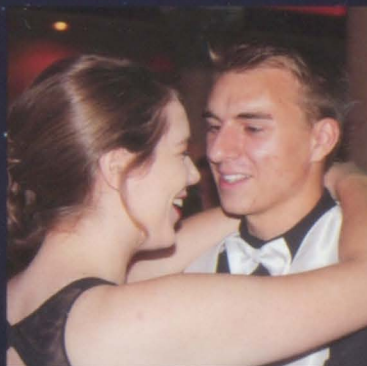
