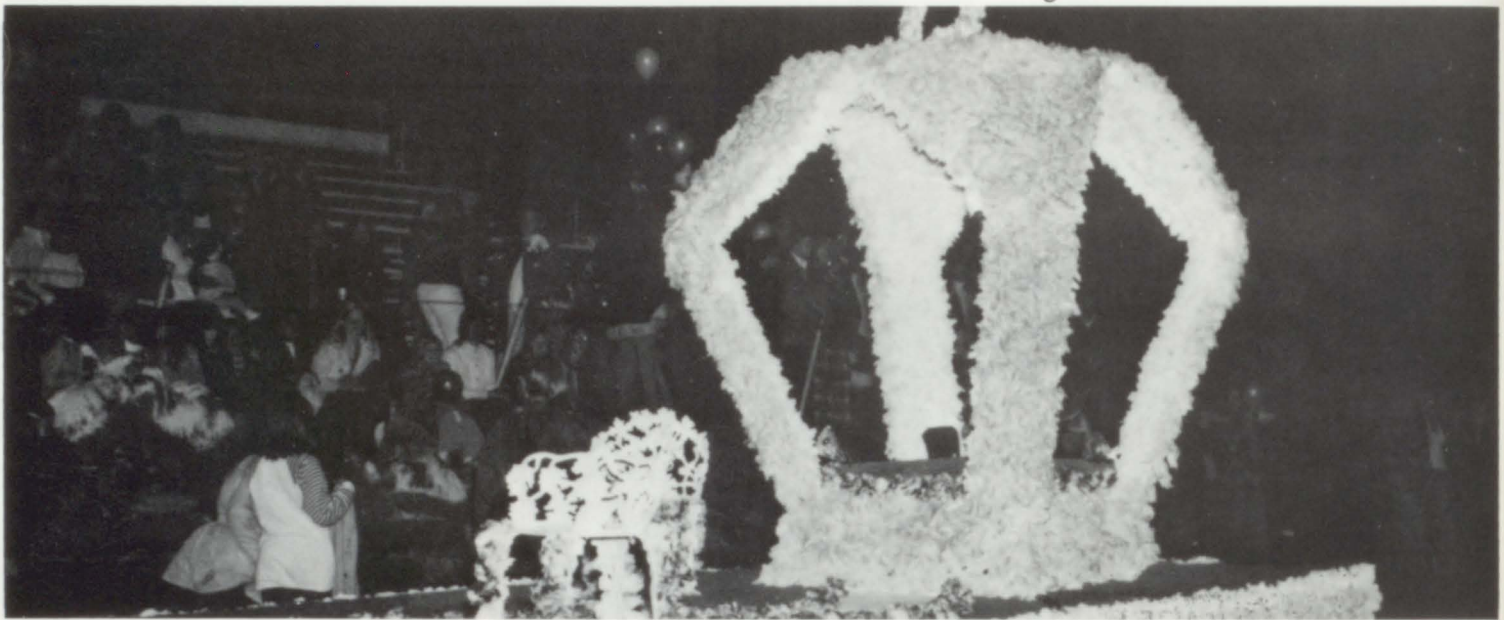
Winning Season Crowned by Homecoming Victory

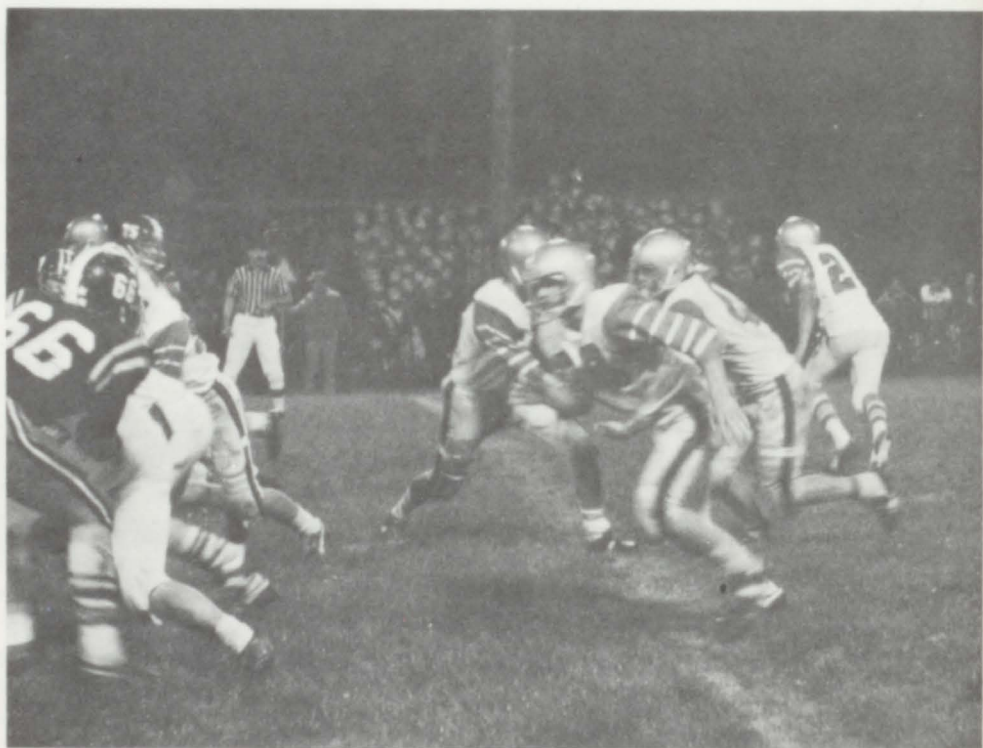

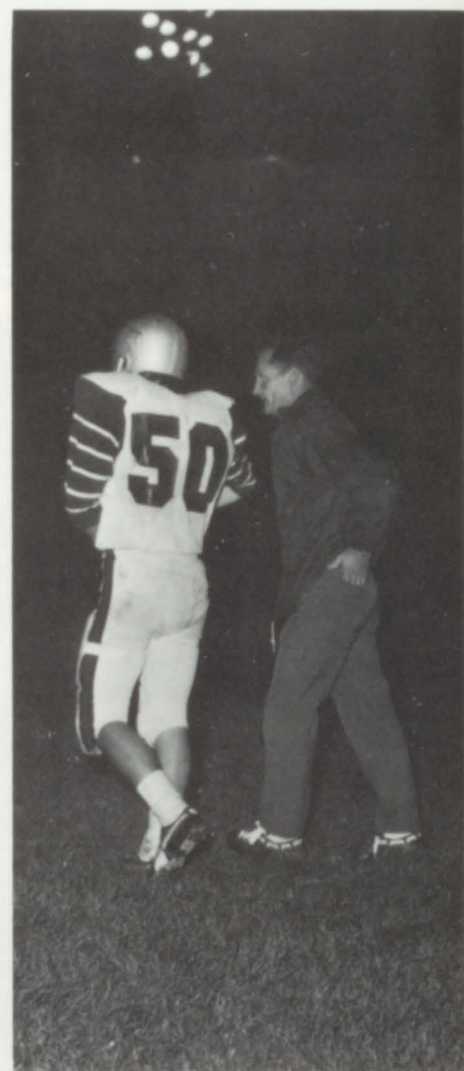

Northwest's basketball team attained the Senate League co-championship this season. "The Tribe" piled up a 15-5 record and was rated as having the best defense in Stark County.

Mark Coffman was named the W.H.B.C. player of the year, and along with John Holzapfel, was nominated for the All-Senate League Team. Coach John Rochus was named Star County Coach of the Year.

"The Tribe" was 14-4 in regular season play and in tournament action beat Sandy Valley 54 to 36 before being beaten by Akron South 74 to 55.

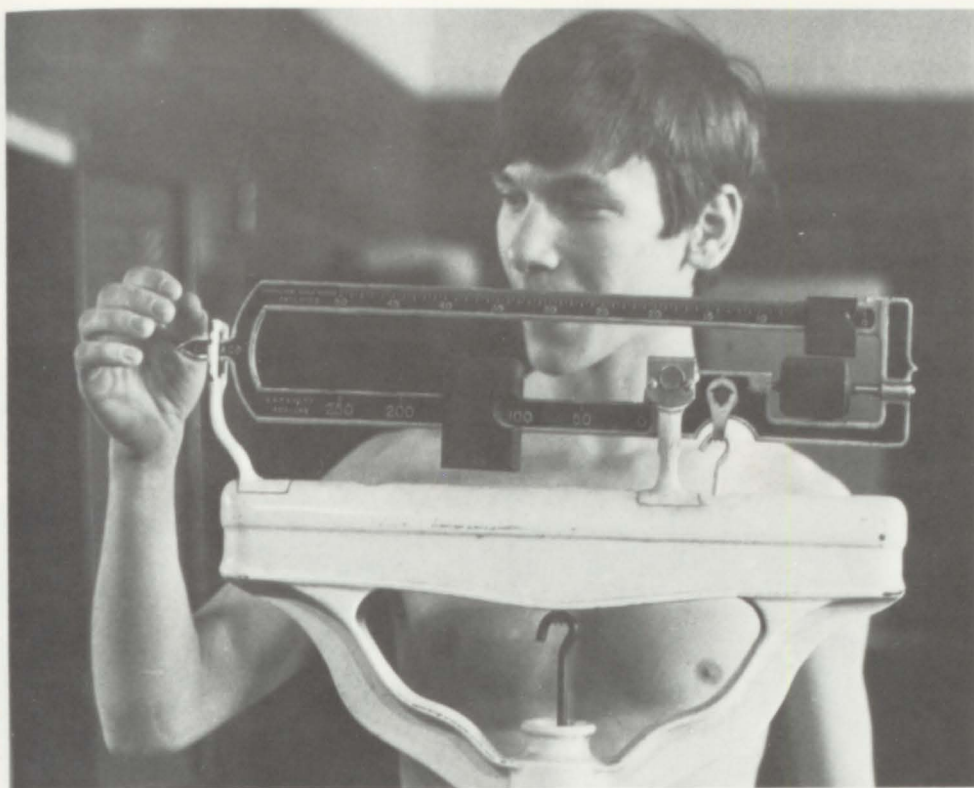

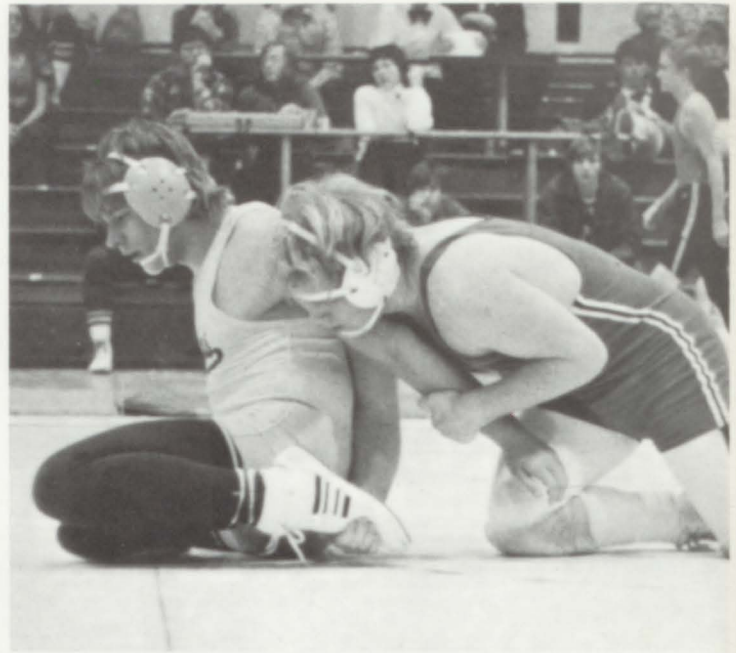
At the end of the season the tribe ranked ninth in state competition and boasted five undefeated grapplers. This was the most successful season in Northwest's wrestling history.

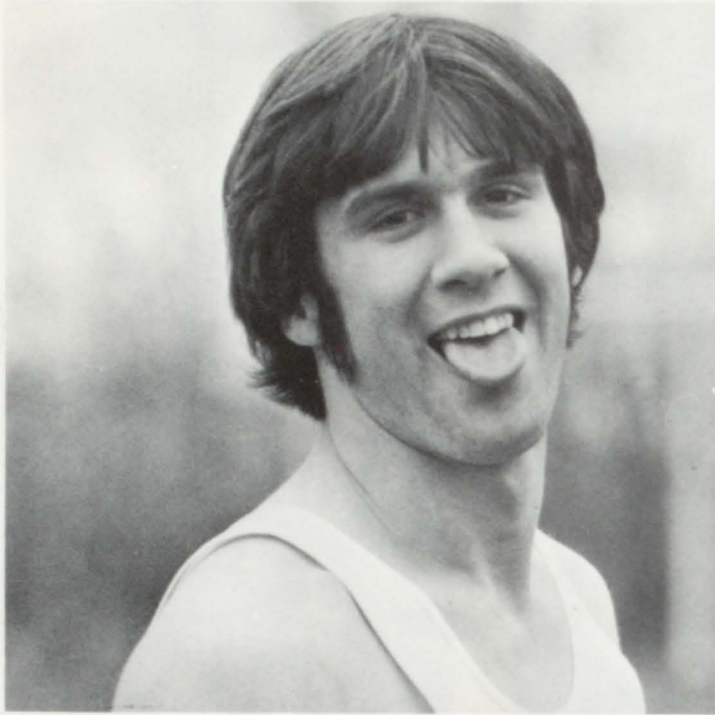

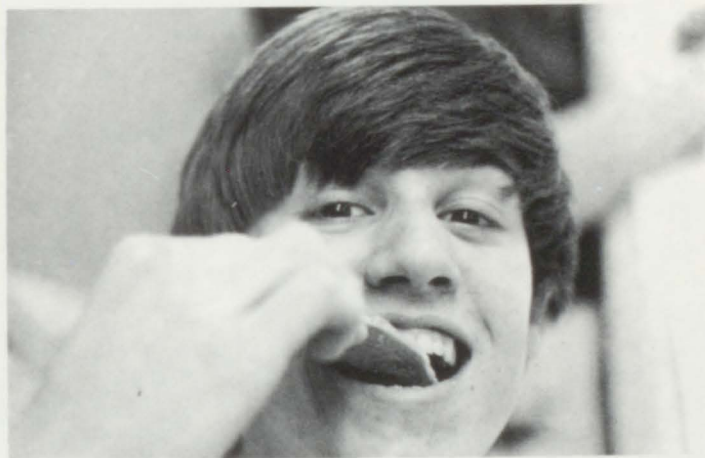

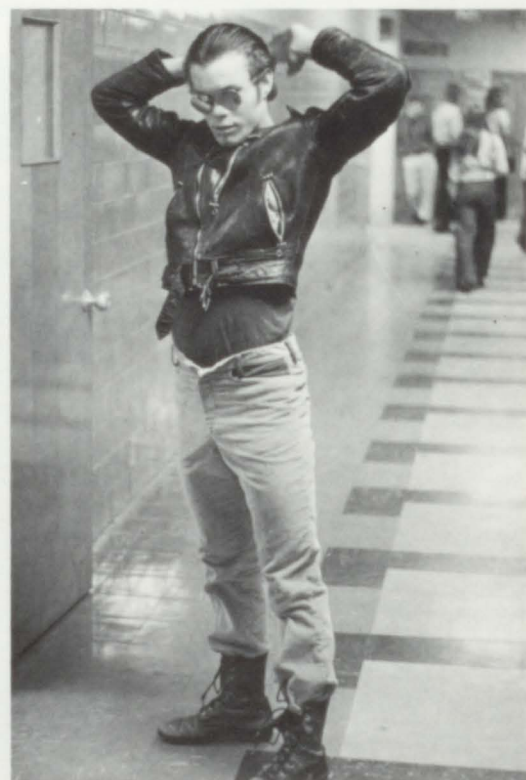

Mrs. Alma Reppart retires this year after 18 years at Northwest and 43 years of teaching and library experience in schools throughout Ohio.

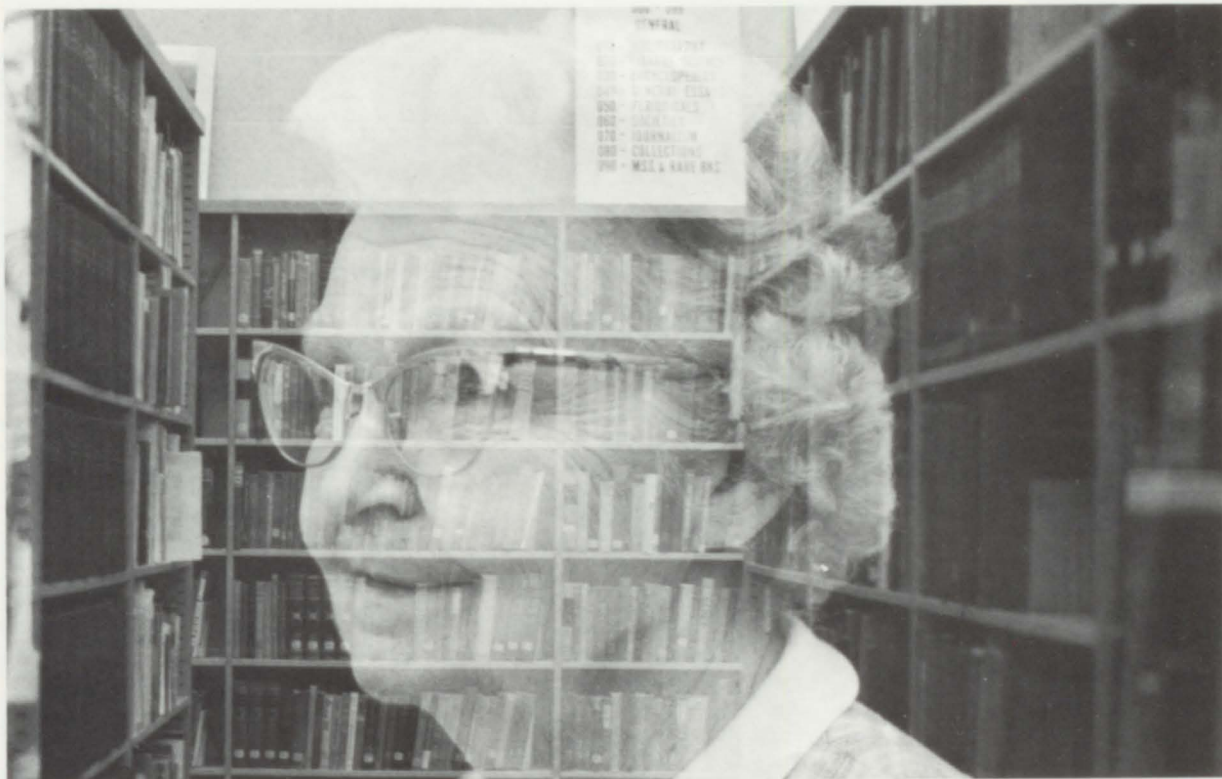
Mrs. Reppart earned her Bachelors degree in Political Science and History at Muskingum College and received her Master's degree in Library Science from Kent State University.

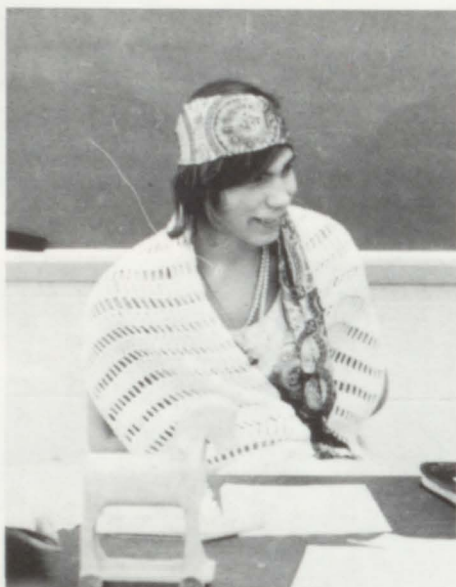
Her career in education began in St. Clairsville where she taught the sixth grade. She then moved back to her home town of Cadiz to teach in grades one through eight. She also spent five years as a teacher-principal at Unionvale School in Green Township. Before coming to Northwest, Mrs. Reppart instructed English, History and American Government at Hopedale High School in addition to serving as their librarian.

In the fall of 1956 Mrs. Reppart arrived at Northwest to help set up the new library. While developing the library and teaching English three, she also found time to direct nine high school plays, including "Old Doc," "Red House Mystery," "Father of the Bride," and "The Thread that Runs So True."

By 1960, the increase in audio and library materials required Mrs. Reppart to devote her full attention to the library. But she found time to organize the Library Club, to help develop the Y-Teens and to serve as an advisor to the National Honor Society.

Through her concern for an expanded library and more honor programs, Mrs. Reppart has encouraged the development of a better education for Northwest students and this community.
